Houghton Lake's Historical Playhouse

Dave Hutko presented to the Rotary Club of Houghton Lake on May 3, 2004. Dave shared some historical information about the Houghton Lake Historical Playhouse and then talked about the funding and how the donations are being spent.

The Playhouse was built in 1927 and is the newest addition at the Historical Village. Originally, it was opened as Johnson's Rustic Dance Palace. In the 1970's, plays started being performed there. The townspeople did five shows a week and two children's matinees on the weekends. It was then turned into a Bingo Hall and most recently became part of the Historical Village when some talks began about tearing it down.

It is currently being used for a variety of events—there are 27 events scheduled for this year already. These events include things such as teen dances, dinners, proms, auctions, weddings, Santa's workshop, and other meetings. Some possible events for the Playhouse include local talents and shows.

Currently, the funding and do-

nations are being used to pay off a loan and the most recent renovation to the Playhouse is the new front entry area. Some recent projects and planned projects are: Installing a phone line, work on lighting, install more outlets, new signs, and a variety of other things. The Playhouse has also been approved for a liquor license.

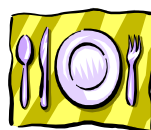
