Pat Clemens, Community Resource Coordinator for the new AuSable Free Clinic in Grayling, presented to the Rotary Club of Houghton Lake on September 19, 2005. The AuSable Free Clinic, Inc. is a nonprofit corporation aimed at assisting our local communities. The clinic was formed and a Board of Directors was elected in 2005, after almost a year of planning by dedicated community leaders from health and human service organizations, businesses, schools, and churches. Volunteer doctors, nurses, and other health professionals provide free primary health care to the uninsured. AuSable Free Clinic, Inc. does not charge for services. The clinic serves the residents of the following counties: Crawford, Roscommon, Oscoda, and Montmorency. It is estimated that over 4,000 people in the area could benefit from this clinic. The Clinic has only been open for six weeks and has already treated 49 patients.

The clinic provides healthcare for people who are working without insurance coverage, working in seasonal or low paying jobs, college students with no family support, homeless or residing in shelters, attempting to become self-sufficient while leaving public assistance, unemployed, or working part-time. Each patient is screened for eligibility at the clinic. Patients must meet established income guidelines.

The clinic received a grant from Blue Cross/Blue Shield to open and Mercy Hospital donated the building. Mercy Hospital also provides lab use, x-rays, and a prescription cart. There is currently one paid position at the clinic, the clinic director. All other services are donated.

The AuSable Free Clinic is located in the Grayling Professional Building at 201 Meadows Drive in Grayling. If you are interested in volunteering at the clinic or would like more information, please call Julie McClure at Mercy Hospital Grayling at (989) 348-0419.
