Waveland, Mississippi, USA — This marks the third time that the Greenfield Rotarians in Hancock County, Indiana, have trekked to Hancock County, Mississippi, to deliver needed supplies for the first responders — the law enforcement officers, firefighters, and others who nearly died in the hurricane, lost their homes, and have worked virtually nonstop for the past three weeks. They also loaded backpacks filled with school supplies for local children and hospital equipment, such as wheelchairs.

The relief effort began when police officers from Greenfield — who were working in New Orleans — learned of conditions in Mississippi during a stop on their way home to Indiana. First responders in the area had lost just about everything, and unlike most evacuees, had no time to get to relief centers to pick up basic supplies, like toilet paper.

They also desperately needed equipment for their jobs — everything from mops to fire hoses to bullets. Rotarians Ralph Lee and Richard Garrett heard the news on 3 September and rallied the community. Within 48 hours they were unloading supplies in Waveland.

The effort, "Hancock County helping Hancock County," grew with each trip. This time, the Rotarians partnered with local law enforcement officers. Rotarian and Deputy Sheriff Bud Grey joined a caravan of a dozen other officers escorting two semi-trucks packed with supplies, purchased in part with a US\$2,000 donation from the Rotary Club of Carmel, Indiana. After an overnight at the jail in Meridian, Mississippi, the team arrives in Waveland. When word gets out that the trucks have arrived, there is a steady stream of police officers and other first responders. Virtually all have lost their homes.

Police officer Keith Joseph bought his home just a week ago. It's a pile of rubble now. "We've been so busy, we just don't have time to get the things we need for our families. It's just wonderful what you all are doing," he tells Grey.

Local Rotarian Tracy DeDeaux stops by the command center, and Grey immediately gives her his card. "Just tell us what people here need. We have a lot of people back home who are ready to help." Before curfew falls, Grey and the team head begin the long drive back to Greenfield. On the road, he talks to Lee by cell phone, and they begin planning to raise more money.
