Notes from Board Meeting of Rotary Club of Houghton Lake – October 11, 2006

Members, Please be advised regarding the distribution of Rotary's RCCF Fund

The board has agreed to post that all Rotarians will have the opportunity to personally submit a proposal or proposals to the Advisory Committee regarding a non-profit organization or agency that they feel could benefit from this fund.

At Wednesday's Board meeting, clarification was given that there is no urgency in distributing Rotary's RCCF funds for fear of losing the authority to do so, as was previously noted in a rumor to the Advisory Committee. The fund can be distributed in part or in full and it does not have to be distributed at all. It will accumulate until a decision is approved by the Rotary Board per advice from the Advisory Committee via membership proposals on how it should be distributed. (The fund has already been accumulating for about 5-6 years.) Once the Rotary Board approves fund distribution, a proposal is made to the RCCF at one of their designated monthly meetings for fund dispersal. It was discussed that each member of the Rotary club should have the opportunity, anytime, to personally submit a proposal or proposals to the Advisory Committee regarding a non-profit organization or agency that they feel could benefit from this fund. Members should submit this in writing and are to be specific on the purpose and the amount of the proposal. The Board is asking club members to submit their proposals by or on October 30, 2006.

The agencies and proposed money amounts recorded from the Advisory Committee's first meeting of October 5th are as follows: Artesia Youth Park-\$1153.80; ARK-\$500 to fund a bird cage with more flight space; HL Bobcat Boosters-\$500, to purchase two bricks in memory of Rotarians, John MacKenzie and Russ Graham; Kenquest House, an agency that helps unwed mothers-\$500; Kirtland Youth Theater-\$300; Project HOPE-\$500; and UPS Ed Charities-\$800, to allow Rotary's total donation this year to equal \$1000. The Rotarians' proposals will be added to this list which will then be submitted to the Advisory Committee for their decision on what organization/s or agency/s should benefit from the funds this year, if any.
