WHAT MORE CAN I DO?

The mission of The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International is to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty.

During this season of giving, and year round, there are many ways to help. For example, every dollar given to the Rotary Foundation brings opportunities for a better world. Half of the money given by District 6290 Rotarians each year is returned to the District in three years, to be used for World Community Service projects, including water projects and others, as described above. This money is readily available to clubs in the District to be used to quickly implement small international humanitarian projects of their choice. Larger grants, of \$5,000 or more may be given by Rotary International to projects initiated by one or a group of clubs, as well as by the District.

Not all clubs or districts feel they are able to handle an international project. Thus, money not redirected to the District from which it came is available to all districts through a competitive process, for the massive relief efforts undertaken by Rotary International and its partners. Rotary was there after the Asian Tsunami, and after Hurricane Katrina in Louisiana. It has all but eradicated polio in the world. It continues to work against malaria, hunger, poor education, impure water, and the many other scourges in underdeveloped countries.

During the year 2005-06, the Rotary foundation awarded \$91.1 million U.S. dollars. These funds were distributed world wide, as follows:
