Fireside Chat with Corky Gaylor

On December 4, 2006, members welcomed Roscommon Rotarian, Corky Gaylor, for a Fireside Chat on Rotary. Corky stated that his purpose was to 'rekindle us on what Rotary is all about.' He noted Rotary's two mottos: "Service Above Self," and "He Profits Most Who Serves Best." He noted the timeline of Rotary: Rotary was started in 1905 in Chicago by Paul Harris, a lawyer. Paul Harris invited three other businessmen, a tailor, a coal dealer and an engineer to meet for the purpose of professional fellowship and spirit. Rotary later became an organization of business professionals who met to help foster awareness of community needs and to improve the lives of the less fortunate. In 1907, Rotary had their first community project-public restrooms in downtown Chicago. In 1910, Rotary became International with a club in Canada. In 1914, there were 100 clubs. In 1924, there were 1000 clubs. (Today, there are over 30,000 clubs throughout the world!)

The Rotary emblem was first presented in 1905 and following many adaptations, it remains the same as its final draft in 1924. The wheel had evoked the image of a well-oiled, efficient machine, working for the service of mankind. Corky mentioned that the 24 cogs around the outside of the wheel symbolize the 24 hours in a day and the hub symbolizes high ethical standards. The keyway represents the members as real workers.

Corky reminded us of the FOUR-WAY TEST of Rotary. Of the things we think, say or do: Is it the TRUTH? Is it FAIR to all concerned? Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS? Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?"

He noted the Four Avenues of Service: Based on the [Object of Rotary](#), the Four Avenues of Service are Rotary's philosophical cornerstone and the foundation on which club activity is based:

- Club Service focuses on strengthening fellowship and ensuring the effective functioning of the club.
- Vocational Service encourages Rotarians to serve others through their vocations and to practice high ethical standards.
- Community Service covers the projects and activities the club undertakes to improve life in its community.
- International Service encompasses actions taken to expand Rotary's humanitarian reach around the globe and to promote world understanding and peace.

Corky reminded the membership of the great things that Rotary has done, such as Polio Plus with the near eradication of polio throughout the world. He congratulated us for all that we do for our community and for helping with needs throughout the world, and he challenged us to KEEP VOLUNTEERISM ALIVE!
