

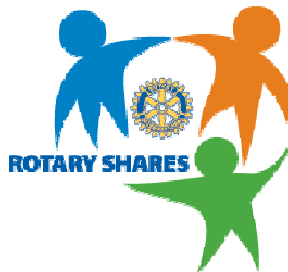

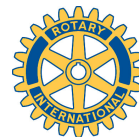

Business meeting called to order at 12:15 pm by Past President, Debbie Banks.

**Club, Community and District:** Carolyn's father had to have emergency eye surgery today so she will not be here. Debbie brought in leftover auction items to offer Rotarians a chance to purchase the items. There is a board meeting next week at 11:00am. Any new officers should consider attending.

**Citizen of the Year:** Tom Moreau handed out nomination forms for our Citizen of the Year award. Please bring your nominations to the next meeting.

**Auction:** Bill thanked all Rotarians for procuring items and selling tickets, but a very special thank you to Rhonda and Gary for all the behind the scene work they do. Bert requested that any final expenditures be given to him for payment by next week so he can wrap up the final costs. He will also invoice any Rotarian that did not procure \$500 on their next dues invoice.

**Program:** Debbie presented the Jaguars with a check. John Kohee from the Jaguars thanked the club for the donation and explained how our contribution allows more kids to enjoy the program. Currently there are 150 kids in the Jaguars program. This year the schedule has been changed to reduce the amount of travel, due to the high gas prices.

**Program II:** Pete gave us an update on the school situation. The bond issue lost by 2 votes. However, the issue will be back on the ballot on August 5<sup>th</sup>. Attendance will be down again next year by about 100 students which will affect how much funding the schools get from the state. A few teachers will be retiring this year that they do not plan on replacing so there will be a few less teachers. The school is removing the custodial staff. In place, they will hire an outside company to hire the custodial employees. They are working with the current custodial staff to find the best option for them, whether it is early retirement, a job with the new company, etc. Pete commented how nice the graduation ceremonies were and that there was a lot of scholarship money given out.
